In WHITE LIMOZEEN Johannes Müller and Philine Rinnert take a look at the tension between colonial opera history and everyday operatic practice, which sometimes seems transnational in an utopian way. Taking Puccini's Madama Butterfly as a starting point, they explore how right (or wrong) it is to re-enact music theater works dating back to times when questions of exoticism, racism and cultural appropriation were answered quite differently than they are today.
